Make sure to include any personality traits, hobbies and attributes that your theme/person has. * How will you incorporate the attributes and traits from your drawing into the yearbook? How would you explain them to your staff? * How will you make sure the theme is clear and consistent throughout the book? (ex. Style Guide, Voice and Storytelling, deadline and spread checklists, coverage planning, etc.) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Some of the best memories you will make this upcoming year will be through spending time with your staff. To help you get started on bonding with your staff, plan a new icebreaker/tradition that meets one or more of the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Celebrates your staff's accomplishments. * Gives your staff a break from working. * Helps your staff get to know each other. * Makes non-yearbook kids wish they were a part of the yearbook. (Good for social media.) * Makes your school's yearbook classroom a special, unique place to be.
