



# WHAT TO BRING

## important legal stuff

- your signed emergency authorization form. (Please email this to us BEFORE CAMP!) You cannot be on campus without our having this on file.)
- your COVID vaccination card, if you did not send a copy of it to us already (We need a copy of this. Snap a photo and send it to us. Name it with your LAST NAME, FIRST NAME and COVID vaccine.) University policy requires COVID vaccinations for all eligible.
- a copy of a negative COVID PCR test. This must be taken within 72 hours of your arrival at camp. So between Wednesday, July 27 and Saturday, July 30. All participants must present a negative test in order to be admitted to the workshop.

## class stuff *(schools can share these supplies)*

- a copy of your 2022 yearbook for reference (and at least one extra for the Yearbook Exchange, more if you have them)
- dictionary/thesaurus (download an app to your phone!)
- 5-10 magazines for design ideas (i.e. ESPN, Real Simple, Esquire, Men's Health, New Beauty, Wired, GQ)
- theme/concept ideas: any material you've started to collect or work on for the 2023 yearbook
- art materials: pens, pencils, markers, scissors, glue stick, construction paper
- access to Google Drive/Dropbox, etc. so you can upload files/images that you want to keep
- digital camera (or your phone)
- If you are an eDesign school, make sure you have a username/password so you can log in (ask your adviser for one!)

## photo stuff *(if you are taking the **what if tracks** "stories without words" or "anticipate and capture the unexpected")*

- DSLR camera
- Lenses - bring any you want to experiment with. Photojournalism students need DSLR cameras with interchangeable lenses.
- Camera batteries/battery chargers
- Memory cards
- Card reader
- Power cable
- Owner's Manual
- Camera Bag
- Laptop: students enrolled in the photo classes will need a laptop.

## computer stuff *(each student will need a laptop)*

Because everything we do involves a computer, students must come with their own laptop computer. Most classrooms have electrical ports for charging. Campus wi-fi codes will be provided at registration.

### **Each laptop must include:**

- ability to transfer files from one computer to another: thumb drive or access to Google Drive/Dropbox/eDesign, etc.
- all software used for yearbook production installed (InDesign, ION, Photoshop, Lightroom, username/password for eDesign)
- power cable
- all necessary passwords and log-ins

## personal stuff *(if you are staying on campus)*

Days in Long Beach are usually warm; mornings and evenings can be foggy and cool. Plan for both.

- **Clothing:** light, comfortable and suitable for classroom environment. Shoes must be worn at all times.
- **Picnic blanket** so you and your staff can sit comfortably on the grass if you want to meet outside.
- **Beach trip:** bathing suit, sunglasses, beach towel, sunscreen, hat
- **Toiletries:** bath towel, washrag, shampoo, soap, blow dryer, sunblock, cosmetics, hydroflask (free water dispenser in the dorms)
- **Dorm room extras:** You may wish to bring hangers, an alarm clock, snacks. There is a refrigerator and a microwave in each dorm room.
- **CSULB provides** sheets, pillow and one blanket. (You may want to bring your own pillow or quilt for comfort.)

## financial stuff *(All planned activities are included in your tuition.)*

- **Key Deposit: \$25 (residents only) is collected at registration** (exact change or check is preferred). If you return your key at the end of camp, you will receive your deposit back. Make checks payable to Yearbooks@theBeach.
- **Parking Permit: \$15/day.** Permits are purchased from the gray kiosks in Lot G2 near the dorms. Residents must purchase a special overnight permit each day. Kiosks take exact change or credit cards. **If you purchased a parking permit with your registration,** we will have those permits ready for you to pick up when you arrive at camp on Sat., July 30. No parking permits may be purchased at registration. These were only available in advance.
- **Extras:** You may bring whatever additional money you wish for vending machines, late-night pizza delivery or souvenirs from the college bookstore.

## what not to bring

Workshop policy prohibits the use of cigarettes, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs or any other controlled substance while enrolled. Students who do not adhere to this policy, as well as all other workshop rules and regulations, will be immediately sent home, after notifying their parents, adviser and principal.
